## Thursday, June 21st

- ♦ 4:00 pm Welcome meeting at the Sala Dante at the Hotel St. Regis in Florence (on Piazza Ognissanti telephone: 011.39.055. 27161), followed by a lecture, *Competition and Collaboration in the Early Renaissance*, by Professor Gary Radke, our program historian.
  - Guests will have time to go to their rooms prior to departing for dinner.
- 6:15 pm Departure from the St. Regis for a private visit to the Bargello Museum, followed by dinner in the Bargello's central courtyard.
  - Dress is business attire with comfortable walking shoes for our visit to the Bargello Museum. A wrap or jacket for the ladies is suggested as we will dine outdoors.

#### Friday, June 22nd

- 9:00 am Departure for a morning visit to Pistoia to visit works by Brunelleschi and Ghiberti, as well as other sites, including the Cathedral and the Baptistry. Our visit to Pistoia will include lunch.
  - Dress for both the day and evening is city casual with comfortable walking shoes. A tie is not required for the gentlemen.
- Afternoon visit to the Frilli Gallery 1860 outside Florence to learn the secrets of bronze casting. This is where the replicas of the *Gates of Paradise* were cast in 1990.
- 7:00 pm Departure for an evening visit to the Museum of Orsanmichele, including cocktails and dinner.

## Saturday, June 23rd

- Private celebration for the completion of the restoration of Ghiberti's *Gates of Paradise*, which received final funding by Friends of Florence with a major grant by Don and Rachel Valentine and John and Gioia Arrillaga.
  - *Dress for our morning events is business attire jacket with tie for the gentlemen with comfortable walking shoes.*
- Our morning program will include a private visit to the Baptistry of Florence for the presentation of a book on Ghiberti. This publication was made possible with a major grant made by Board members Kathe and John Dyson. We will also visit the Opificio delle Pietre Dure to view the completed restoration of Ghiberti's Gates of Paradise.
- Our morning activities will conclude with a visit to the Cathedral Museum followed by a luncheon.
- Visit to view the recently-restored bronze Giambologna Cross and the Cloister of the Vows of SS Annunziata, a future Friends of Florence project.
- Later-afternoon departure for the wine estate of Nipozzano, in the area where Ghiberti had agricultural properties.
  - Attire for the evening is country casual. A blazer with tie is recommended for the gentlemen. Please bring a jacket or wrap for cooler evening temperatures.
- Wine tasting dinner at the Castle of Nipozzano, owned by the Marchesi Frescobaldi, Board members of Friends of Florence.

## Sunday, June 24th

- In the morning, program participants have the opportunity to attend Mass in celebration of St. John the Baptist, the Patron Saint of Florence.
- In the later morning we will visit the Horne Museum, followed by a private lunch.
- Free afternoon in Florence to relax or to enjoy and observe the festivities for the feast day of St. John the Baptist.
- ◆ Cocktails and dinner in the private Palazzo Gondi, owned by Marchese Bernardo and Marchesa Vittoria Gondi. The evening will include a viewing of the spectacular fireworks hosted by the city of Florence from the terraces of the Palace.
